PURPOSE OF POSITION

This post will be an exciting opportunity for a practicing Christian who has experience as a family and/or youth worker to:

- a) establish neighbourhood outreach work, and
- b) develop work with families within our church and neighbourhood.

The successful candidate will be instrumental in the development and implementation of a Family Outreach strategy.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

1. To be visionary and instrumental in building relationships between the church and the wider local community including creating missional opportunities. Of particular emphasis would be building relationships between COTR and local community development programs with a focus on youth mental health; as well as developing ways to use our facility and other resources for the greater benefit of our neighbours.
2. To help those who come to faith to find their home in the Christian faith community
3. To provide leadership to the Sunday School program including recruiting, liaising and supporting teachers, ordering curriculum and other supplies and offering vision and guidance for that ministry
4. To regularly share in planning and leading worship, particularly where children and families attend, including the planning of quarterly all-age worship
5. To contribute to maintaining an inclusive space of safety and belonging for all.
6. To know and adhere to all diocesan and parish policies, particularly the Diocese of Toronto's Sexual Misconduct and Screening Policies.
7. To attend bi-weekly Staff meetings and monthly Leadership Team meetings.
8. To conduct all activities associated with this position in a manner consistent with the Parish Mission Statement and Core Values.
9. To perform other duties as assigned by the Wardens or the Incumbent.

QUALIFICATIONS

A person of Christian faith with a demonstrated commitment to integrating their faith into their daily life.

A minimum of 3-5 years experience in a similar or related field.

A university, college or seminary degree would be an asset.

COMPENSATION

This position receives a starting annual salary of \$33,000 with an expectation of 28 hours per week. A benefits package is provided through the Anglican Church of Canada.

The Family Outreach Worker is required to attend on Sundays and at significant community celebrations except when on holiday and is entitled to three weeks of paid holiday each year.
